The CRFU have long enabled Clubs to claim back accredited training costs (for the likes of coaching, 1st aid, etc.)

This scheme has now been widened to include accredited courses (like food hygiene) which support Clubs being able to provide food to people using their facilities.

Therefore, as for the existing course costs, any cost incurred up to £30 will be 100% refunded by the CRFU, and anything beyond £30 will be refunded at 50% of the cost.

So far this season I have been able to see the men's sides at Lankelly, Bodmin, St Austell Spartans, Helston, Newquay, St Austell, St Ives, Pirates Ams, Liskeard and Veor.

For our women's teams I have visited Camborne when they played their league opener against Paignton and, weather permitting, I should be at the Inner Warrior Game between Falmouth and St Austell.

In addition, I visited the representatives of the Women & Girls games at St Austell, Perranporth, Redruth and Truro with our RFU Club Developer, Rachel Miller.

It has been fantastic seeing such a variety of clubs and meeting so many people all working hard to promote our fantastic game and ensure we get teams out on Saturdays and Sundays.

During these visits many people also took the opportunity to discuss the on-going challenge of fielding teams to meet league fixtures. This seems to be mostly down to short term player unavailability, although we also need to focus on player recruitment and retention.

The beginning of the season has been challenging for many clubs with several games not fulfilled and volunteer time stretched. Everyone within the CRFU is focussed on finding ways to help clubs play their games and are working hard with league officials, while also looking at other initiatives to find a mutually acceptable way to do so.

Get your club ready for Adult Player Registration

HELP YOUR PLAYERS REGISTER TO PLAY RUGBY

Your club's players can now register themselves to play in 2024/25



From the Premiership to the community game, all adult players must complete the quick and easy online process before the start of the season.

Players registered at your club last season should log into GMS and click the 'Renew Player Registration (Adult)' button to renew their registration. No action is required from Club Registrars. Find more information here.

Players registered at a different club last season and joining your club for the 2024/25 season should renew their registration at their previous club. Club Registrars can then transfer the player to the new club on GMS. Find more information here.

Players that have not been registered before and do not have a GMS account should create an account before registering to play.

Club Registrars must review and approve/reject these registration requests. Find more information here.
